Synopsis of Bill

House Memorial 44 requests that the City of Albuquerque collaborate with the Public Service Company of New Mexico (PNM) to study the feasibility of creating a walking path within the Casa Grande Linear Park.

Casa Grande Linear Park is a twenty-six-year-old, 12.2 acre neighborhood park located east of Tramway Boulevard and between Menaul Boulevard and Montgomery Boulevard in Albuquerque.

The memorial finds the following facts in support of a collaborative effort to install a walking path in Casa Grande Linear Park.

There is an Albuquerque Police station at the north end of the park.

The residents of the area have requested a walking path through the park that would connect Montgomery Boulevard and Candelaria Road.

The PNM easement and the private property on either side of the park could impede the installation of a walking path.

The memorial requests that the City of Albuquerque collaborate with PNM to study the feasibility of creating a walking path in Casa Grande Linear Park.
