# FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill carries no appropriation. The fiscal impact associated with the memorial is the continuation of ongoing efforts by the departments.

## **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

After-school programs could produce connections with individuals or activities that are healthy and supportive of positive growth and development of life skills. Those who attend programs that emphasize healthy relationships and behaviors are less likely to engage in risk-related relationships and behaviors.

After-school programs could promote relationships with supportive adults as well as positive peer-bonding opportunities within the school. They could also provide the extracurricular activities that might appeal to different interests (Spreading Resiliency, 2006).
