Synopsis of Bill

House Memorial 107 requests the interagency behavioral health purchasing collaborative convene a team of appropriate stakeholders to discuss a plan for the sustainability of the New Mexico screening, brief intervention and referral to treatment (SBIRT) program in integrated primary care and school-based health clinics.

The memorial requests that a funding plan be developed to include Medicaid, general fund or economic stimulus money, as well as grant opportunities for sustainability, and that the plan include the maintenance and continuity of the SBIRT telehealth network.

The findings and recommendations of the team shall be presented to the interim Legislative Health and Human Services Committee by August 1, 2009.
