## Synopsis of Bill

House Resolution 1 proposes a new House Rule 7-18 allow "in all cases" the wearing of a bolo tie along with "business attire befitting the decorum of the house" as permissible. This would also apply to visitors on the floor of the house.

### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The bolo tie was officially adopted as New Mexico's state tie in 2007.

It is likely that as New Mexico's state tie, the bolo tie could still meet the standards for proper decorum in the House of Representatives.
