### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Concurrent Resolution 1 proposes that the New Mexico legislature adopt a joint rule that would limit the number of bills introduced by each member of the legislature to no more than fifteen (15) during a legislative session. It excludes from counting towards the total two (2) bills endorsed by an interim legislative committee and bills introduced at the request of the governor or a state agency. Either house can suspend the limit by a two-thirds vote in that house. Legislators may transfer any part of their allotment to another member of the same house.
