SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

DVS reports that Angel Fire is the home of the world renowned Vietnam Veterans Memorial State Park. Thousands of veterans from around the country travel to Angel Fire to visit the memorial every year. This memorial would study the feasibility of developing a center where veterans can seek treatment for a variety of health issues in a peaceful setting. Currently, there is no center dedicated solely to treating veterans in a rural, peaceful area of the country. A center such as this may be an economic boost to the local economy of the Moreno Valley by attracting veterans from around the country.
