For more than a quarter of a century, Cowboys For Cancer Research has sponsored team roping and a dinner-dance in Las Cruces to support cancer research at the University of New Mexico and New Mexico State University.

Cowboys for Cancer Research has built an endowment worth one million dollars (\$1,000,000), the spendable portion of which is directed to cancer research conducted jointly by the University of New Mexico and New Mexico State University.

Cowboys for Cancer Research constitutes the largest single consistent contributor to the University of New Mexico Cancer Center.

For the last several years, cowboys for cancer research has joined with New Mexico State University in its "tough enough to wear pink" breast cancer awareness events on campus and at athletic competitions.

In addition to making financial contributions, men and women can show their support for breast cancer research in a visible way by wearing pink.

According to the HED, in 2008, C4CR's 26th annual event and the 2nd annual NMSU Aggies ARE Tough Enough to Wear Pink Breast Cancer Awareness Initiative raised a combined \$800,000 including a cash contribution to the C4CR/Alma Cohorn Memorial Endowment of \$400,000. The total amount contributed to the endowment is now over \$1,000,000.
