Synopsis of Bill

Senate Memorial 81 requests the Public Education Department (PED) to collaborate with state institutions of higher learning, gifted education organizations and the legislative education study committee to determine the requirements for a gifted education endorsement on teaching licenses.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Senate Memorial 81 requests the Public Education Department to collaborate with state institutions of higher learning, gifted education organizations and the legislative education study committee to determine the requirements for a gifted education endorsement on teaching licenses. The memorial requests that PED take into consideration the existing coursework at the colleges of education at the state institutions of higher education that offer specialized gifted education programs for students.

The department's study should consider endorsement competencies for gifted education teachers, such as those proposed in the Technical Assistance Manual for Gifted Education in New Mexico and portfolio guidelines for gifted education, such as those developed by the New Mexico association for the gifted. The study should identify assessments that are currently available in gifted education that could be adopted in New Mexico.
