Senate Memorial 83 requests that the Public Education Department (PED) provide school districts a guide for interweaving a tolerance curriculum into the existing content standards for kindergarten through twelfth grade with the aim of creating schools across New Mexico in which children can learn in an environment of respect, safety, and diversity.
