SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 17 reduces general fund appropriations contained in Laws 2009, Chapter 1 (Feed Bill), Sections 3 through 9, for permanent legislative offices by 6.8 percent. Although each legislative agency has a separate appropriation, the legislative council service is given authority to apply the reduction where needed to effectuate government efficiency.

The bill will be effective upon passage and signing due to the emergency clause.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill reduces FY10 general fund appropriations to the permanent legislative offices by \$1,076.9 excluding Legislative Building Services, which is included in Section 4 of the 2009 General Appropriation Act.
