Bill Summary:

HM 13 requests that the Public Education Department (PED) convene a work group to review current reporting requirements to determine which can be repealed or amended without impacting student safety and academic, cocurricular and extracurricular programs, in collaboration with representatives from

- the New Mexico School Boards Association;
- the New Mexico Coalition of School Administrators;
- the New Mexico Coalition for Charter Schools; and
- other pertinent stakeholders.

The memorial further requests that the work group report its findings to the Legislative Education Study Committee (LESC), the Legislative Finance Committee (LFC), and the Governor no later than November 1, 2012.

Fiscal Impact:

Legislative memorials do not contain appropriations.

Background:

For consideration of the 2012 legislative session, the New Mexico School Boards Association endorsed a resolution for a study to identify and recommend removal of all unfunded, unnecessary, excessive, and duplicative laws, regulations, and reporting requirements.
