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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONCHILD SEXUAL ABUSE
17	PREVENTION TASK FORCECREATEDMEMBERSDUTIESREPORT
18	A. The governor shall appoint a "child sexual abuse
19	prevention task force" to serve from the date of appointment
20	until December 1, 2012. The task force shall consist of the
21	following members:
22	(1) the secretary of children, youth and
23	families, who shall serve as chairperson of the task force;
24	(2) the secretary of public education, who
25	shall serve as the vice chairperson of the task force;
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1 the secretary of health, or the (3) 2 secretary's designee; (4) the secretary of public safety, or the 3 secretary's designee; 4 (5) the secretary of Indian affairs, or the 5 secretary's designee; 6 7 (6) the public defender, or the public defender's designee; 8 9 (7) the following members appointed by the governor so as to reflect the geographic distribution of the 10 members and the cultural diversity of the state: 11 12 (a) a district attorney; a representative of the New Mexico 13 (b) 14 school superintendents association; one public school teacher, one (c) 15 public school counselor and one public school social worker; 16 17 and a representative of an organization (d) 18 19 involved with child sexual abuse prevention; one public member appointed by the speaker 20 (8) of the house of representatives; and 21 (9) one public member appointed by the 22 president pro tempore of the senate. 23 Non-ex-officio members of the task force shall Β. 24 be individuals who are actively involved in the areas of 25 .188035.1 - 2 -

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1 prevention, detection, reporting, investigation, prosecution 2 and treatment of child sexual abuse. The task force shall: 3 C. 4 (1) study: (a) academic research concerning child 5 sexual abuse prevention and efforts in other states to prevent 6 7 child sexual abuse; 8 (b) data concerning child sexual abuse 9 in New Mexico; and (c) current efforts and policies of 10 state agencies, school districts, other local government 11 12 agencies and community-based programs for the prevention, detection, reporting, prosecution and treatment of child sexual 13 14 abuse; receive reports and testimony from state (2) 15 and local agencies, public schools, community-based and other 16 public and private organizations involved in child sexual abuse 17 prevention or treatment and other interested persons; and 18 19 (3) make recommendations to the governor and 20 the legislature by December 1, 2012 for methods and practices to reduce child sexual abuse in New Mexico. In making the 21 recommendations, the task force shall focus on specific 22 statutory changes and changes to state, local and public school 23 policies that increase and improve prevention and reporting of 24 child sexual abuse and methods to improve cooperation between 25 .188035.1

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and among state agencies, district attorneys, public schools and community-based organizations involved in preventing, detecting, reporting, prosecuting and treating child sexual abuse.

D. As part of its duties to focus on public policies related to child sexual abuse, the task force, in cooperation with school districts, shall develop a schooltargeted state policy to address child sexual abuse that includes:

10 (1) a model age-appropriate curriculum for 11 students in pre-kindergarten through fifth grade;

(2) training for school personnel on child sexual abuse, including strategies for providing emotional and educational support for sexually abused children;

(3) educational information for parents and guardians to be included in school handbooks on the warning signs of child sexual abuse, along with assistance, referral and resource information;

(4) a statewide master list of available counseling and resources for children affected by sexual abuse, listed by community and school district; and

(5) methods for increasing teacher, student and parent awareness of issues involving child sexual abuse.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately. .188035.1

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
