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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. Section 22-13-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
16	Chapter 153, Section 57, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"22-13-1. SUBJECT AREASMINIMUM INSTRUCTIONAL AREAS
18	REQUIREDACCREDITATION
19	A. The department shall require public schools to
20	address department-approved academic content and performance
21	standards when instructing in specific department-required
22	subject areas as provided in this section. A public school or
23	school district failing to meet these minimum requirements
24	shall not be accredited by the department.
25	B. All kindergarten through third grade classes
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<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete shall provide daily instruction in reading and language arts skills, including phonemic awareness, phonics and comprehension, and in mathematics. Students in kindergarten and first grades shall be screened and monitored for progress in reading and language arts skills, and students in second grade shall take diagnostic tests on reading and language arts skills.

All first, second and third grade classes shall 8 C. provide instruction in art, music and a language other than 9 English, and instruction that meets content and performance 10 standards shall be provided in science, social studies, 12 physical education and health education.

In fourth through eighth grades, instruction D. that meets academic content and performance standards shall be provided in the following subject areas:

(1) reading and language arts skills, with an emphasis on writing and editing for at least one year and an emphasis on grammar and writing for at least one year;

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(2) mathematics:

- (3) language other than English;
- communication skills; (4)
- (5) science;
- (6) art;
- (7) music;
- social studies; (8)

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1	(9) New Mexico history;
2	(10) United States history;
3	(11) geography;
4	(12) physical education; and
5	(13) health education.
6	E. Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, in
7	eighth grade, algebra l shall be offered in regular classroom
8	settings or through online courses or agreements with high
9	schools.
10	F. In fourth through eighth grades, school
11	districts shall offer electives that contribute to academic
12	growth and skill development and provide career and technical
13	education. In sixth through eighth grades, media literacy may
14	be offered as an elective.
15	G. In ninth through twelfth grades, instruction
16	that meets academic content and performance standards shall be
17	provided in health education.
18	H. Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, in
19	preparation for high school course work, sixth through eighth
20	grades shall require successful completion of a minimum number
21	of units in language arts, mathematics, science and social
22	studies aligned to the state academic content and performance
23	standards as follows:
24	(1) in sixth grade:
25	(a) one unit in language arts; and

2	(2) in seventh grade:

9	(b) one unit in mathematics;
10	(c) one unit in science;
11	(d) one unit in social studies; and
12	<u>(e) two electives.</u> "
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
