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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 15-8-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994,
19	Chapter 119, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"15-8-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Transportation
21	Services Act:
22	A. "director" means the director of the division;
23	B. "division" means the transportation services
24	division of the general services department;
25	<u>C. "protective license plate" means a regular</u>
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1 passenger license plate issued to a state vehicle that is in 2 the custody of a state agency, can be traced to that state agency and is being used for sensitive activities; 3 [G.] D. "secretary" means the secretary of general 4 5 services: [D.] E. "state agency" means a state department, 6 7 agency, board or commission but does not include the legislative and judicial branches, public schools and 8 9 institutions of higher education; [and E.] F. "state vehicle" means an automobile, van, 10 sport-utility truck, pickup truck or other vehicle with a 11 12 declared gross vehicle weight of less than ten thousand pounds used by a state agency to transport passengers or property; and 13 G. "undercover license plate" means a regular 14 passenger license plate issued to a state vehicle that is 15 registered in a fictitious name and address that cannot be 16 traced to the state agency having custody of the vehicle and is 17 being used for legitimate law enforcement purposes only." 18 SECTION 2. Section 15-8-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, 19 20 Chapter 119, Section 6, as amended by Laws 2009, Chapter 8, Section 1 and by Laws 2009, Chapter 129, Section 1 and also by 21 Laws 2009, Chapter 250, Section 6) is amended to read: 22 "15-8-6. STATE VEHICLES--USE--MARKINGS--STATE GOVERNMENT 23 PLATES. --24

A. The division shall adopt rules governing the use .188958.1SA

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1 of vehicles used by state agencies or by other persons pursuant 2 to Subsection [G] I of this section, including driver 3 requirements and responsibilities, under what circumstances someone can be assigned a state vehicle on a permanent or 4 semipermanent basis and when custody of a state vehicle can be 5 vested in another state agency. 6

Β. The division may determine that it is impractical to retain custody of certain state vehicles, and it may provide that custody reside in another state agency in the following cases:

the state vehicle is used for emergency or (1)12 law enforcement purposes; or

the state vehicle is a department of (2) transportation, energy, minerals and natural resources department, department of game and fish or homeland security and emergency management department passenger vehicle, truck or tractor or heavy road equipment.

C. Except as provided in Subsections [E and] F, <u>G</u> and H of this section, all state vehicles shall be marked as state vehicles. Each side of the vehicle shall be marked, in letters not less than two inches in height, with the following designation of ownership: "State of New Mexico, ...... Department" or "State of New Mexico Department of ....." and naming the department using the vehicle.

Except as provided in Subsections [E and] F,  $\underline{G}$ D. .188958.1SA

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<u>and H</u> of this section, all state vehicles shall have specially
 designed government registration plates.

E. [Only state vehicles used for legitimate undercover law enforcement purposes are exempt from the requirements of Subsections C and D of this section.] Except as provided in Subsections F, G and H of this section, all [other] state vehicles owned or in the custody of state agencies that have law enforcement functions shall be marked and have state government registration plates.

F. State vehicles used for legitimate undercover
law enforcement purposes are exempt from the requirements of
Subsections C, D and E of this section and may be issued an
undercover license plate when it is determined by the division
that issuance of such a license plate is necessary to protect
legitimate undercover law enforcement activities.

G. State vehicles used for other sensitive activities are exempt from the requirements of Subsections C, D and E of this section and may be issued a protective license plate when it is determined by the division that issuance of such a license plate is necessary to protect the health, safety or welfare of a state employee using a state-owned vehicle for sensitive activities. The standards for the issuance of a protective license plate pursuant to this subsection shall be determined by rule jointly promulgated by the division and the motor vehicle division of the taxation and revenue department.

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1 [F.] H. A state agency may seek custody of state 2 vehicles as an exception to Subsection B of this section or an exemption to the provisions of Subsection C of this section by 3 making a written request to the director, specifying the 4 5 reasons for the proposed custody or exemption. The director may approve the custody or exemption, in writing, indicating 6 7 the duration and any conditions of the custody or exemption. [6.] I. The division shall adopt rules permitting 8 9 individuals enrolled in the state's adaptive driving program to use special-use state vehicles for evaluation and training 10 purposes in that program." 11 12 SECTION 3. Section 66-6-15 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 35, Section 350, as amended) is amended to read: 13 14 "66-6-15. VEHICLES OF THE STATE, COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY .--15 Vehicles or trailers owned by and used in the 16 Α. service of an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo located wholly or 17 partly in this state or of any county or municipality of this 18 19 state need not be registered but must continually display 20 plates furnished by the division. Vehicles on loan from dealers and used in an Β. 21 approved driver-training program by the public schools need not 22

C. Each Indian nation, tribe or pueblo, each county .188958.1SA

be registered but must continually display plates furnished by

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and each municipality shall apply to the division for a plate for each vehicle or trailer in its service and shall provide identifying information concerning each vehicle or trailer for which a plate is applied.

D. The division shall issue plates for vehicles and trailers in the service of an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo located wholly or partly in this state or of any county or municipality of this state and keep a record of plates issued and plates returned. The plates shall be permanent and need not be renewed from year to year. The plates shall be numbered to identify the Indian nation, tribe or pueblo, the county or the municipality to which the plates are issued. The plates shall be the same size as registration plates issued to private vehicles but shall be different in color from the registration plates issued to private vehicles.

E. A vehicle or trailer owned by and used in the service of the state need not be registered with the division but must continually display a plate furnished by the transportation services division of the general services department. A state agency shall apply to the transportation services division of the general services department for a plate for each vehicle or trailer in its service, including identifying information for each vehicle or trailer. The transportation services division of the general services department shall issue plates for state agency vehicles and .188958.1SA

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1 trailers and shall keep a record of plates issued and plates 2 returned. These plates shall be: 3 permanent and shall not be renewed from (1)4 year to year; 5 (2) numbered to identify the state agency to which they are issued; and 6 the same size as but a different color 7 (3) from registration plates issued to private vehicles or trailers 8 9 or from plates issued pursuant to Subsection D of this section. F. The division may issue to an Indian nation, 10 tribe or pueblo located wholly or partly in this state or any 11 county or municipality of this state or an entity not subject 12 to registration pursuant to Section 66-6-14 NMSA 1978: 13 (1) an undercover license plate when it is 14 determined by the division that the issuance of such a license 15 plate is necessary to protect legitimate undercover law 16 enforcement activities; or 17 (2) a protective license plate when it is 18 19 determined by the division that the issuance of such a license 20 plate is necessary to protect the health, safety or welfare of an employee using a vehicle owned by the Indian nation, tribe, 21 pueblo or entity for sensitive activities. 22 G. The standards for the issuance of a protective 23 license plate pursuant to Paragraph (2) of Subsection F of this 24 section shall be determined by rule jointly promulgated by the 25 .188958.1SA
