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## 50TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - SECOND SESSION, 2012

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AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS; PROHIBITING CERTAIN CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDRAISING BY BUSINESS ENTITIES, LOBBYISTS AND STATE CONTRACTORS AND THEIR PRINCIPALS; RECONCILING MULTIPLE AMENDMENTS TO THE SAME SECTION OF LAW IN LAWS 2009.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Campaign Reporting Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] BUSINESS ENTITIES--CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDRAISING FOR CANDIDATES PROHIBITED. --

A business entity shall not make or bundle contributions or sponsor or host fundraising on behalf of a public officer, a candidate for nomination or election to a public office or a campaign committee established by the candidate.

**SECTION 2.** A new section of the Campaign Reporting Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] LOBBYISTS--CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDRAISING
FOR CANDIDATES PROHIBITED.--

- A. A lobbyist, subject to the Lobbyist Regulation Act, shall not make or bundle contributions or sponsor or host fundraising on behalf of a public officer, a candidate for nomination or election to a public office or a campaign committee established by the candidate.
- B. A public officer or candidate described in Subsection A of this section shall not solicit or accept a contribution prohibited by that subsection.
- C. The provisions of this section shall not restrict a lobbyist from establishing a campaign committee for the lobbyist's own campaign."
- **SECTION 3.** A new section of the Campaign Reporting Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] STATE CONTRACTORS--CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDRAISING FOR CANDIDATES PROHIBITED.--

A. A state contractor or a principal of a state contractor shall not make or bundle contributions or sponsor or host fundraising on behalf of a public officer, a candidate for .188506.2

nomination or election to a public office or a campaign committee established by the candidate.

- B. A public candidate officer or candidate described in Subsection A of this section shall not accept or solicit a contribution prohibited by that subsection.
- C. The provisions of this section shall not restrict a principal of a state contractor from establishing a campaign committee for the principal's own campaign."

SECTION 4. Section 1-19-26 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1979, Chapter 360, Section 2, as amended by Laws 2009, Chapter 67, Section 1 and by Laws 2009, Chapter 68, Section 2) is amended to read:

"1-19-26. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Campaign Reporting Act:

- A. "advertising campaign" means an advertisement or series of advertisements used for a political purpose and disseminated to the public either in print, by radio or television broadcast or by any other electronic means, including telephonic communications, and may include direct or bulk mailings of printed materials;
- B. "anonymous contribution" means a contribution the contributor of which is unknown to the candidate or the candidate's agent or the political committee or its agent who accepts the contribution;
- C. "bank account" means an account in a financial .188506.2

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institution located in New Mexico;

"business entity" includes, whether organized inside or outside of this state, a sole proprietorship, partnership, joint venture, limited liability company, corporation and any other association, organization or entity that is engaged in the operation of a business or profit-making activity;

- $[\underline{\mathsf{D}}_{\boldsymbol{\cdot}}]$   $\underline{\mathsf{E}}_{\boldsymbol{\cdot}}$  "campaign committee" means two or more persons authorized by a candidate to raise, collect or expend contributions on the candidate's behalf for the purpose of electing the candidate to office;
- [E.] F. "candidate" means an individual who seeks or considers an office in an election covered by the Campaign Reporting Act, including a public official, who either has filed a declaration of candidacy or nominating petition or:
- (1) for a non-statewide office, has received contributions or made expenditures of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more or authorized another person or campaign committee to receive contributions or make expenditures of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more for the purpose of seeking election to the office; or
- (2) for a statewide office, has received contributions or made expenditures of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or more or authorized another person or campaign committee to receive contributions or make

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expenditures of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or more for the purpose of seeking election to the office or for candidacy exploration purposes in the years prior to the year of the election;

 $[F_{\tau}]$   $G_{\cdot}$  "contribution" means a gift, subscription, loan, advance or deposit of money or other thing of value, including the estimated value of an in-kind contribution, that is made or received for a political purpose, including payment of a debt incurred in an election campaign, but "contribution" does not include the value of services provided without compensation or unreimbursed travel or other personal expenses of individuals who volunteer a portion or all of their time on behalf of a candidate or political committee, nor does it include the administrative or solicitation expenses of a political committee that are paid by an organization that sponsors the committee;

[6.] H. "deliver" or "delivery" means to deliver by certified or registered mail, telecopier, electronic transmission or facsimile or by personal service;

[H-] I. "election" means any primary, general or statewide special election in New Mexico and includes county and judicial retention elections but excludes municipal, school board and special district elections;

[ $J_{\text{-}}$ ]  $\underline{K}_{\text{-}}$  "expenditure" means a payment, transfer or distribution or obligation or promise to pay, transfer or distribute any money or other thing of value for a political purpose, including payment of a debt incurred in an election campaign or pre-primary convention, but does not include the administrative or solicitation expenses of a political committee that are paid by an organization that sponsors the committee;

"political committee" means two or more persons, other than members of a candidate's immediate family or campaign committee or a husband and wife who make a contribution out of a joint account, who are selected, appointed, chosen, associated, organized or operated primarily for a political purpose; and "political committee" includes:

[K.] L. "person" means an individual or entity;

- (1) political parties, political action committees or similar organizations composed of employees or members of any corporation, labor organization, trade or professional association or any other similar group that raises, collects, expends or contributes money or any other thing of value for a political purpose;
- (2) a single individual whose actions represent that the individual is a political committee; and
