SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 26 repeals Section 30-7-9 NMSA 1978 (Firearms; Sale and Purchase) effective July 1, 2012 in which New Mexico residents are permitted to buy firearms in contiguous states and residents of contiguous states are permitted to buy firearms in New Mexico.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The Department of Public Safety reports no fiscal impact.

There may be a small increase to gross receipts taxes related to the sale of firearms, however, the Taxation and Revenue Department does not capture tax data at that highly granular level. The closest information it retains is gross receipts on sporting goods.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Attorney General reports the repealing of the section makes New Mexico law consistent with the Federal Firearm laws.
