## SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill
Senate bill 224 amends Section 34-7-15 NMSA 1978 to add and increase certain Probate Court copying and certification fees. The bill would increase fees for making copies of records or papers to $\$ 1.00$ per page, increase the fee for certificate and seal authenticating any paper as a true and correct copy from $\$ .50$ to $\$ 1.00$ and it would impose a fee of $\$ 3.00$ for authentication of a paper with a triple seal.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

According to the AOC, new probate court copying and certification fees and increases to current fees will offset the increased costs of paper and staff time involved in providing these services and which are currently not reimbursed.

## ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The AOC reports that the collecting and processing of the new fees will increase probate court workload to a limited extent.
