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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 74-1-13 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
19	Chapter 317, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"74-1-13. WATER CONSERVATION FEEIMPOSITION
21	DEFINITIONS
22	A. There is imposed on every person who operates a
23	public water supply system a water conservation fee in an
24	amount equal to three cents ( $\$.03$ ) per thousand gallons of
25	water produced on which the fee imposed by this subsection has
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2	B. The "water conservation fund" is created in the
3	state treasury and shall be administered by the department [ <del>of</del>
4	environment]. The fund shall consist of water conservation
5	fees collected pursuant to this section. Balances in the fund
6	at the end of any fiscal year shall not revert to the general
7	fund but shall accrue to the credit of the fund. Earnings on
8	the fund shall be credited to the fund.
9	C. Money in the water conservation fund is
10	appropriated to the department [ <del>of environment</del> ] for
11	administration of a public water supply program to:
12	(1) test public water supplies for the
13	contaminants required to be tested pursuant to the provisions
14	of Section 1412 of the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, as
15	[ <del>finalized through July 1, 1992</del> ] <u>amended</u> , [ <del>and</del> ] collect
16	chemical compliance samples as required by those provisions of
17	the federal act and create a list of contaminants to be tested;
18	(2) perform vulnerability assessments [ <del>which</del> ]
19	that will be used to assess a public water supply's
20	susceptibility to those contaminants; and
21	(3) implement new requirements of the Utility
22	Operators Certification Act and provide training for all public
23	water supply operators.
24	D. The taxation and revenue department shall
25	provide by regulation for the manner and form of collection of
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the water conservation fee. All water conservation fees collected by the taxation and revenue department, less the administrative fee withheld pursuant to Section [<del>1 of this 1997</del> act] <u>7-1-6.41 NMSA 1978</u>, shall be deposited in the water conservation fund.

E. The fee imposed by this section shall be
administered in accordance with the provisions of the Tax
Administration Act and shall be paid to the taxation and
revenue department by each person who operates a public water
supply system in the manner required by the department on or
before the twenty-fifth day of the month following the month in
which the water is produced.

F. Each operator of a public water supply system shall register and comply with the provisions of Section 7-1-12 NMSA 1978 and furnish such information as may be required by the taxation and revenue department.

<u>G. The department shall compile a list of the</u> <u>contaminants that require testing pursuant to Paragraph (1) of</u> <u>Subsection C of this section. The list shall be compiled no</u> <u>less than once every twelve months and include the contaminants</u> <u>that will be tested in the subsequent twelve months. The</u> <u>department shall establish by rule procedures to compile the</u> <u>list and to determine if any additional contaminants will be</u> <u>tested. The determination of whether additional contaminants</u> <u>will be tested shall include consideration of the availability</u> .192280.1
