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AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY PLACEMENT OF CHILDREN; ALLOWING THE CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES DEPARTMENT TO CONDUCT FEDERAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS OF ADULTS RESIDING IN THE HOME; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Children's Code is enacted to read:

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"EMERGENCY PLACEMENT--CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK .--

In an emergency placement situation, when a 11 Α. child must be placed in a home due to the absence of parents 12 or custodians, the department shall request that a criminal 13 justice agency perform a federal name-based criminal history 14 15 record check of each adult residing in the home. The results of the name-based check shall be provided to the department, 16 and, within fifteen days from the date that the name-based 17 check was conducted, the department shall provide a complete 18 set of each adult resident's fingerprints to the department 19 20 of public safety for immediate submission to the federal bureau of investigation. The department of public safety 21 shall positively identify the fingerprint subject, if 22 possible, and forward the fingerprints to the federal bureau 23 of investigation within fifteen calendar days from the date 24 that the name-based search was conducted. The child may be 25

SB 41 Page 1 removed from the home immediately if any adult resident fails to provide fingerprints or written permission to perform a federal criminal history record check when requested to do so.

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5 Β. When placement of a child in a home is denied 6 as a result of a name-based criminal history record check of a resident and the resident contests that denial, the 7 resident shall, within five business days, submit to the 8 department a complete set of the resident's fingerprints with 9 10 written permission allowing the department to forward the 11 fingerprints to the department of public safety for submission to the federal bureau of investigation. 12

C. The department of public safety may charge a
reasonable fee for processing a fingerprint-based criminal
history record check.

D. As used in this section, "emergency placement" refers to those limited instances when the department is placing a child in the home of private individuals, including neighbors, friends or relatives, as a result of sudden unavailability of the child's primary caretaker."

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
