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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
8	SECTION 1. A new section of the Uniform Licensing Act
9	is enacted to read:
10	"EXPEDITED LICENSUREMILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS AND
11	SPOUSES OR DOMESTIC PARTNERSVETERANS
12	A. A state agency, board or commission that issues
13	an occupational or professional license pursuant to Chapter
14	61, Articles 2 through 34 NMSA 1978 shall, as soon as
15	practicable after a military service member, the spouse or
16	domestic partner of a military service member or a recent
17	veteran files an application for a license accompanied by the
18	required fees:
19	(1) process the application; and
20	(2) issue a license to a qualified applicant
21	who submits satisfactory evidence that the applicant holds a
22	license that is current and in good standing, issued by
23	another jurisdiction, including a branch of the armed forces
24	of the United States, that has met the minimal licensing
25	requirements that are substantially equivalent to the

SB 258 Page l licensing requirements for the occupational or professional license the applicant applies for pursuant to Chapter 61, Articles 2 through 34 NMSA 1978.

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B. A license issued pursuant to this section is not a provisional license and must confer the same rights, privileges and responsibilities as a license issued pursuant to Chapter 61, Articles 2 through 34 NMSA 1978.

8 C. A license issued pursuant to this section shall 9 not be renewed unless the license holder satisfies the 10 requirements for the issuance and for the renewal of a 11 license pursuant to Chapter 61, Articles 2 through 34 NMSA 12 1978. Upon the issuance of a license pursuant to this 13 section, the issuing state agency, board or commission shall 14 notify the license holder of the requirements for renewing 15 the license in writing.

D. A state agency, board or commission that issues a license pursuant to Chapter 61 NMSA 1978 shall establish procedures necessary to implement this section by July 1, 2013, including rules for the renewal of licenses pursuant to Subsection C of this section.

E. This section applies only to an application for
an occupational or professional license pursuant to
Chapter 61 NMSA 1978 filed on or after July 1, 2013.

F. As used in this section:

(1) "military service member" means a person SB 258 Page 2

1	who is serving in the armed forces of the United States or in	
2	an active reserve component of the armed forces of the United	
3	States, including the national guard; and	
4	(2) "recent veteran" means a person who has	
5	received an honorable discharge or separation from military	
6	service within the two years immediately preceding the date

8	license pursuant to this section."
