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has a total combined family income of no more 7 Ε. 8 than sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) per year adjusted annually on January 1 to reflect any change from the previous 9 10 year's then-current consumer price index for all urban consumers published by the bureau of labor statistics of the 11 United States department of labor in either of the calendar 12 years ending within the student's junior or senior years in 13 high school or in the case of a student whose immediate 14 15 family has more than one family member enrolled full time in an eligible institution of post-secondary education, a total 16 combined family income of no more than an amount as 17 determined by the department to be equivalent to a 18 sixty-thousand dollar (\$60,000) total combined family income; 19

F. has complied with all the rules adopted by the department for award of the scholarship and the provisions regarding the administration of scholarships adopted pursuant to the New Mexico Scholars Act; and

24 G. is a citizen of the United States or has a25 permanent resident visa."

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1 SECTION 5. Section 21-21H-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, 2 Chapter 212, Section 8, as amended) is amended to read: 3 "21-21H-8. TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS.--A scholarship is terminated upon the substantial noncompliance by the award 4 5 recipient with the New Mexico Scholars Act or the rules promulgated by the department pursuant to that act." 6 SECTION 6. Section 21-21H-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, 7 8 Chapter 212, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read: 9 "21-21H-9. RULES.--The department may adopt such rules 10 as necessary or appropriate to implement the provisions of the New Mexico Scholars Act. A financial aid officer may 11 exercise professional judgment when special circumstances 12 exist to adjust the cost of attendance or the expected family 13 contribution or to modify other factors that make the program 14 15 responsive to a student's special financial circumstances and for which documentation exists in the student's file within 16 the parameters authorized for this program." 17 SECTION 7.
