SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 184 designates the Chair of the Gaming Control Board to serve ex officio as a member of the State Racing Commission. The total number of State Racing Commission remains at five but the requirement of three practical breeders as members is reduced to two. In addition, only two of the four remaining members can be from the same political party rather than the current three. The bill reiterates that appointed members receive only per diem and mileage for their service.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill has no fiscal impact.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

With the elimination of one practical breeder of racehorses, the Racing Commission notes concern that the expertise and experience of the total membership may be diluted. The majority of the Racing Commission members should have a vast understanding of the needs of the industry in order to provide the best regulation and enforce statues for all participants.
