SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 186 amends Section 17-3-13.7 NMSA 1978 to include an oryx license along with the current deer, antelope, elk, javelin and turkey that can be purchased at the resident rate for a nonresident disabled active duty member or veteran of the United States armed forces who is undergoing a rehabilitation program that involves hunting activities and that is sponsored by the federal government or a nonprofit organization authorized by the federal government and is under the direction of a military or federal veterans administration rehabilitation center.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

DGF projects this may encourage those eligible to purchase a license when they might not otherwise, thus, generating a small additional revenue for the Game Protection Fund.
