### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

The House Judiciary Committee substitute for House Bill 316 prohibits organizing and participation in coyote-killing contests. Persons who organize coyote killing contests will be guilty of a misdemeanor and participants will be guilty of a petty misdemeanor.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The fiscal impact in the table above is a range based on the annual incarceration costs for one to 10 individuals. The cost to county detention facilities per inmate per day assumed is \$86.81.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The bill provides that coyote killing which is organized or permitted by the state game commission and the killing of coyotes for the purpose of “protecting a person or property” shall not be prohibited.
