Currently the Attorney General is unable to retain outside counsel to pursue legitimate claims against actors violating the Unfair Practices Act. Because the Attorney General lacks resources to pursue each such claim in house, the State of New Mexico and its consumers are not compensated for some unlawful acts. The legislation would potentially remedy that problem.
