Senate Joint Memorial 25 requests Congress to consider the Education for All Act of 2011.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Education for All Act of 2011 would amend the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 to promote primary education in developing countries as an objective of United States foreign assistance policy to promote universal access to quality primary education for children. The Education for All Act has been endorsed by the New Mexico chapters of the National Education Association, the American Federation of Teachers, the New Mexico Association for the Education of Young Children and the New Mexico Public Health Association.
