10	A JOINT MEMORIAL
11	REQUESTING THE FORMATION OF A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE
12	RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN TOBACCO USE AND EMPLOYER COSTS, INCLUDING
13	THE IMPACTS ON ORGANIZATIONS THAT EMPLOY TOBACCO USERS.

15	WHEREAS, tobacco use is the leading preventable cause of
16	death in the United States, responsible for about one of every
17	five deaths annually; and
18	WHEREAS, smoking cost the United States more than one
19	hundred ninety-three billion dollars (\$193,000,000,000) a year
20	between 2001 and 2004, including ninety-seven billion dollars
21	(\$97,000,000,000) in lost productivity annually and ninety-six
22	billion dollars (\$96,000,000,000) in direct health care
23	expenditures annually; and
24	WHEREAS, smoking accounted for more than three million
25	years of potential life lost in men and two million years of

potential life lost in women between 2000 and 2004, reducing life expectancy by approximately fourteen years; and

WHEREAS, smoking-attributable health care expenditures
totaled an estimated ninety-six billion dollars
(\$96,000,000,000) annually between 2001 and 2004, up more than
twenty billion dollars (\$20,000,000,000) from seventy-five
billion five hundred million dollars (\$75,500,000,000) in 1998;
and

9 WHEREAS, there are no incentives for New Mexico employers 10 to establish smoking cessation programs or develop tobacco-free 11 campuses; and

WHEREAS, on the contrary, New Mexico law may actually impede efforts to reduce tobacco use, interfere with reasonable employment practices and not allow for incentives for employers to improve employee health and productivity; and

WHEREAS, the state would benefit from a review of those laws;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the following organizations be requested to form a task force to study the relationship between tobacco use and employer costs, including the impacts on organizations that employ tobacco users, and recommend changes in laws to decrease workplace productivity losses and employer and employee health care and insurance costs due to tobacco use: the association of commerce and industry of New .190832.4
