10 A JOINT MEMORIAL

11 PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 6, 2013 "SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION  
12 DISTRICT DAY" AT THE LEGISLATURE.

14 WHEREAS, land, water and other resources are the basic  
15 physical assets of New Mexico, and their conservation and  
16 development are necessary to protect and promote the health and  
17 general welfare of the people of the state; and

18 WHEREAS, New Mexico is experiencing severe drought that is  
19 affecting water supplies; and

20 WHEREAS, New Mexico watersheds face over-vegetation and  
21 other challenges that affect water yields; and

22 WHEREAS, endangered species and interstate compact issues  
23 are complicating water shortage issues; and

24 WHEREAS, the forty-seven soil and water conservation  
25 districts have applied these measures to conserve and develop

1 the natural resources of the state for over fifty years in New  
2 Mexico by "putting conservation on the ground"; and

3 WHEREAS, soil and water conservation districts are  
4 organized and perpetuated by the provisions of the Soil and  
5 Water Conservation District Act and are governmental  
6 subdivisions of the state;

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE  
8 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that February 6, 2013 be proclaimed "Soil  
9 and Water Conservation District Day" at the legislature and  
10 that recognition be extended to the men and women who serve to  
11 protect the fragile environment crucial to the well-being of  
12 the state of New Mexico; and

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be  
14 transmitted to the New Mexico association of conservation  
15 districts.
