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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. Section 22-2-8.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986,
16	Chapter 33, Section 2, as amended by Laws 2011, Chapter 35,
17	Section 1 and by Laws 2011, Chapter 154, Section 1) is amended
18	to read:
19	"22-2-8.1. SCHOOL YEAR[LENGTH OF SCHOOL DAY] MINIMUM
20	INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS
21	[A. Except as otherwise provided in this section,
22	regular students shall be in school-directed programs,
23	exclusive of lunch, for a minimum of the following:
24	(1) kindergarten, for half-day programs, two
25	and one-half hours per day or four hundred fifty hours per year
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1	or, for full-day programs, five and one-half hours per day or
2	nine hundred ninety hours per year;
3	(2) grades one through six, five and
4	one-half hours per day or nine hundred ninety hours per year;
5	and
6	(3) grades seven through twelve, six hours per
7	day or one thousand eighty hours per year.
8	B.] A. In a school year, public school students
9	shall be in programs, exclusive of lunch, for the following
10	minimum instructional hours:
11	<u>(1) for students in kindergarten attending</u>
12	half-day programs, five hundred instructional hours and, for
13	students in kindergarten attending full-day programs, one
14	thousand one hundred instructional hours;
15	(2) for students in grades one through six,
16	one thousand one hundred instructional hours; and
17	(3) for students in grades seven through
18	twelve, one thousand two hundred instructional hours.
19	B. For a school that follows a regular school year
20	calendar, a school year consists of a minimum of two hundred
21	instructional days that provide the minimum instructional hours
22	established in Subsection A of this section in four ten-week
23	quarters evenly spaced in a calendar year. For a school that
24	follows a variable school calendar pursuant to the Variable
25	School Calendar Act, the department shall approve a school's
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1	requested length and number of instructional days in a school
2	year that provides the minimum instructional hours established
3	in Subsection A of this section in four quarters evenly spaced
4	<u>in a calendar year.</u>
5	C. The following programs may count toward the
6	calculation of the minimum instructional hours in a school
7	<u>year:</u>
8	(1) professional development programs provided
9	by the school district;
10	(2) up to thirty-three hours of the full-day
11	kindergarten program [ <del>may be used</del> ] for home visits by the
12	teacher or for parent-teacher conferences;
13	(3) up to twenty-two hours of grades one
14	through six programs [ <del>may be used</del> ] for home visits by the
15	teacher or for parent-teacher conferences; and
16	(4) up to twelve hours of grades seven through
17	twelve programs [ <del>may be used</del> ] to consult with parents to
18	develop next step plans for students and for parent-teacher
19	conferences.
20	D. Days or hours when no instruction is given due
21	to weather, in-service training, teacher planning and
22	preparation or other events that are not programs set forth in
23	Subsection C of this section shall not count toward the
24	calculation of minimum instructional hours.
25	$[C_{\bullet}]$ <u>E.</u> Nothing in this section precludes a local
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school board <u>or the governing body of a charter school</u> from [setting a school year or the length of school days in excess of] <u>increasing</u> the <u>number of</u> minimum [requirements] <u>instructional hours</u> established [by Subsection A of] <u>in</u> this section.

[D. The secretary may waive the minimum length of school days in those school districts where such minimums would create undue hardships as defined by the department as long as the school year is adjusted to ensure that students in those school districts receive the same total instructional time as other students in the state.

G.] <u>F.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, provided that instruction occurs simultaneously, time when breakfast is served or consumed pursuant to a state or federal program shall be deemed to be time in a school-directed program [and is part of the instructional day] that counts toward the calculation of minimum instructional hours."

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Two hundred sixty-one million one hundred thirty-four thousand dollars (\$261,134,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the state equalization guarantee for expenditure in fiscal year 2015 to provide for twenty additional instructional days. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2015 shall revert to the general fund.
