House Memorial 5 resolves the establishment of the Four Corners national veterans' cemetery in Gallup be supported.

The Veterans' Services Department is requesting \$600 thousand in state capital outlay funds to be matched by \$6 million in Veterans' Services Administration funds to plan, design and construct four national cemeteries around the state in unspecified locations.

Each national cemetery requires two full-time equivalents (FTE) for maintenance and burials, equipment costs, and utility costs totaling a minimum of \$82 thousand for operating costs.
