15	SECTION 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted

19	A. Unauthorized distribution of sensitive images
20	consists of distributing, publishing or otherwise making

22	means, sensitive images of a person, with or without

"electronic communications device" means a (1)11 12 computer, an internet web site or page, a video recorder, a digital camera, a fax machine, a telephone, a cellular 13 14 telephone, a pager or any other device that can produce an electronically generated image, message or signal; and 15 "sensitive images" means images, 16 (2) photographs, videos or other likenesses of any portion of a 17 person's genitals, or of a woman's breast below the top of the 18 19 areola, that is either uncovered or visible through less-than-20 fully opaque clothing, which images may reasonably be considered to be private, intimate or inappropriate for 21 distribution and publication without that person's consent. 22 C. Whoever commits unauthorized distribution of 23 sensitive images is guilty of a misdemeanor. Upon a second or 24 subsequent conviction, the offender is guilty of a fourth 25
