16	SECTION 1. Section 29-4A-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995,
17	Chapter 59, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

1 The legislature further finds that when peace officers Mexico. 2 or New Mexico mounted patrol members are killed in the line of duty, their immediate families can suffer grievously, both 3 emotionally and economically. To recognize the substantial 4 5 public safety benefits conferred by peace officers and New Mexico mounted patrol members and in consideration of the 6 7 sacrifices undertaken by these peace officers and New Mexico mounted patrol members and their families for the citizens of 8 9 New Mexico, it is the purpose of the Peace Officers' and New Mexico Mounted Patrol Members' Survivors Supplemental Benefits 10 Act to ensure that certain supplemental death benefits accrue 11 12 to the spouse and surviving children or to the parents, if there are no surviving children or there is no spouse, of a 13 14 peace officer or New Mexico mounted patrol member killed in the line of duty." 15 Section 29-4A-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, SECTION 3. 16 Chapter 59, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read: 17 DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Peace Officers' "29-4A-3. 18 19 and New Mexico Mounted Patrol Members' Survivors Supplemental 20 Benefits Act: "fund" means the peace officers' and New Mexico 21 Α. mounted patrol members' survivors fund; 22 "New Mexico mounted patrol" means members of 23 Β. units or troops officered and manned to assist with law 24 enforcement pursuant to the provisions of Sections 29-6-1 and 25

"peace officer" means any full-time salaried and commissioned or certified law enforcement officer of a police or sheriff's department or a conservation officer of the department of game and fish as used in Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 that is part of or administered by the state or any political subdivision of the state; and

9 [C.] D. "secretary" means the secretary of public 10 safety."

SECTION 4. Section 29-4A-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 59, Section 4) is amended to read:

"29-4A-4. FUND CREATED.---The "peace officers' and New <u>Mexico mounted patrol members'</u> survivors fund" is created in the state treasury and shall be administered by the department of public safety. The fund shall consist of all gifts, donations and bequests of money to the fund as well as any appropriations made to the fund. Earnings from investment of the fund shall be credited to the fund. Money in the fund is appropriated to the department of public safety for the purpose of paying death benefits pursuant to the Peace Officers' <u>and</u> <u>New Mexico Mounted Patrol Members'</u> Survivors Supplemental Benefits Act and shall be paid out only upon warrants issued by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of public safety. 1 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining in the fund at the 2 end of any fiscal year shall not revert."

SECTION 5. Section 29-4A-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 59, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"29-4A-5. PEACE OFFICERS' <u>AND NEW MEXICO MOUNTED PATROL</u> <u>MEMBERS'</u> SURVIVORS SUPPLEMENTAL DEATH BENEFITS--REVIEW COMMITTEE--DETERMINATION--PAYMENT.--

A. There is created the "peace officers' <u>and New</u> <u>Mexico mounted patrol members'</u> survivors supplemental death benefits review committee". The committee shall consist of the attorney general, the chief of the New Mexico state police and the state president of the fraternal order of police or their designees.

B. The peace officers' <u>and New Mexico mounted</u> <u>patrol members'</u> survivors supplemental death benefits review committee shall determine whether a peace officer <u>or New Mexico</u> <u>mounted patrol member</u> has been killed in the line of duty and advise the secretary of that determination. In addition to any other death benefits provided by law, the surviving spouse, children or parents shall be paid two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) as supplemental death benefits whenever a peace officer <u>or New Mexico mounted patrol member</u> is killed in the line of duty. The benefits shall be paid from the fund.

C. The benefits shall be paid first to the surviving spouse. If there is no surviving spouse, the .200038.1
