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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 29-13-2.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
18	Chapter 179, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"29-13-2.1. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Law Enforcement
20	Protection Fund Act:
21	A. "academy" means the New Mexico law enforcement
22	academy;

17	SECTION 2. Section 29-13-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,		
18	Chapter 179, Section 6, as amended by Laws 2002, Chapter 78,		
19	Section 5 and by Laws 2002, Chapter 92, Section 3) is amended		
20	to read:		
21	"29-13-4. DETERMINATION OF NEEDS AND RATE OF		
22	DISTRIBUTION		
23	A. Annually on or before April 15, the division		
24	shall consider and determine the relative needs as requested by		
25	tribal, municipal and university police [and], county sheriff's		
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departments and regional facilities for money in the fund pursuant to the provisions of Subsection C of this section.

As necessary during the year, the division shall Β. transfer an amount from the [law enforcement protection] fund to the peace officers' survivors fund that enables the balance of the peace officers' survivors fund to be maintained at a minimum balance of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000).

C. The division shall determine the rate of distribution of money remaining in the fund to each tribal, municipal and university police and county sheriff's department 12 as follows:

all municipal police and county sheriff's (1)departments shall be rated by class pursuant to this paragraph in accordance with populations established by the most recently completed decennial census; provided that the population of any county shall not include the population of any municipality within that county that has a municipal police department. The rate of distribution to which a municipal police or county sheriff's department is entitled is the following:

[(3)] (4) tribal police departments shall be 6 7 entitled, unless allocations are adjusted pursuant to the provisions of Subsection $[\mathbf{f}]$ <u>D</u> of this section, to six hundred 8 9 dollars (\$600) for each commissioned peace officer in the tribe. To be counted as a commissioned peace officer for the 10 purposes of this paragraph, a commissioned peace officer shall 11 12 have been assigned to duty and have worked in New Mexico for no fewer than two hundred days in the calendar year immediately 13 prior to the date of payment. Payments shall be made for only 14 those divisions of the tribal police departments that perform 15 services in New Mexico. [No] A tribal police department shall 16 not be eligible for any disbursement under the fund if 17 commissioned peace officers cite non-Indians into the tribal 18 court for civil or criminal citations; and 19

[(4)] <u>(5)</u> municipal and university police and county sheriff's departments shall be entitled, unless allocations are adjusted pursuant to the provisions of Subsection D of this section, to six hundred dollars (\$600) for each police officer or sheriff's deputy employed full time by [<u>his</u>] <u>a</u> department who has been certified by the [<u>New Mexico</u> .199595.1 <u>- 4 -</u>

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law enforcement] academy as a police officer or has been authorized to act as a New Mexico peace officer pursuant to the provisions of Section 29-1-11 NMSA 1978.

After distributions are determined in accordance D. with Subsection A, Subsection B and Paragraphs (1), [and] (2) and (3) of Subsection C of this section, if the balance in the fund is insufficient to permit the total allocations provided by Paragraphs [(3)] (4) and [(4)] (5) of Subsection C of this section, the division shall reduce that allocation to the maximum amount permitted by available money."

SECTION 3. Section 29-13-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983, Chapter 289, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"29-13-5. DETERMINATION OF NEEDS--REVIEW.--No later than May 1 of each year, the division shall notify in writing each affected municipal police, university police, tribal police [and], county sheriff's department, regional facility and the academy of its determination of money to be distributed pursuant to the provisions of Section 29-13-4 NMSA 1978. Any affected department, regional facility or the academy may appeal that determination by filing a notice of appeal with the secretary of finance and administration no later than May 15. If an appeal is filed, the secretary of finance and administration shall review the determination of the division in an informal and summary proceeding and shall certify the result of the appeal to the division no later than June 30, and .199595.1

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1 the division shall adjust its determination accordingly. If no 2 appeal is filed, the original determination of the division shall be final and binding and not subject to further review." 3 SECTION 4. Section 29-13-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983, 4 5 Chapter 289, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read: "29-13-7. EXPENDITURE LIMITATION--CONTROL.--6 7 Except as provided for regional facilities and Α. the academy in Subsection B of this section, amounts 8 9 distributed from the fund shall be expended only for the 10 following: the repair and purchase of law enforcement 11 (1)12 apparatus and equipment, including the financing and 13 refinancing thereof, that meet minimum nationally recognized 14 standards; (2) the purchase of law enforcement equipment, 15 including protective vests, for police dogs; 16 expenses associated with advanced law 17 (3) 18 enforcement planning and training; 19 (4) maintaining the balance of the peace 20 officers' survivors fund at a minimum amount of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000); 21 complying with match or contribution (5) 22 requirements for the receipt of federal funds relating to 23 criminal justice programs; and 24 (6) no more than fifty percent of the 25 .199595.1 - 6 -
