### **SUMMARY**

### Synopisis of HRPAC Amendment:

The House Regulatory and Public Affairs Committee amends the effective date to April 1, 2016.

### Synposis of Original Bill:

On any Game and Fish Department (DGF) license, permit or stamp, HB 203 provides a 50 percent discount to New Mexico residents who have either veteran or active duty military status.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

DGF revenue from licenses is expected to decrease by 4.1 percent, or \$245 thousand, per fiscal year. See also, "Revenue Impact Estimation" table, next page.

### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

DGF reported that an effective date prior to April 1, 2016 – the start of the department's license year – would impose "significant hardship for the agency." DGF suggested an effective date on April 1, 2016 to provide sufficient time for the agency to implement the system and promote the license opportunity to persons who qualify, in coordination with the new license year.

DGF also suggested that two classes of veteran licenses be kept alongside HB 203:

The 100% disabled game hunting license and the disabled resident veteran game hunting and fishing licenses. These two license types offer more than a 50% discount and the Department spports keeping those licenses as valid license offerings.
