Synopsis of SJC Amendment

The Senate Judiciary Committee amendment to House Bill 430 strikes Section 2, findings and purpose. The amendment renumbers the succeeding sections accordingly.

Synopsis of Original Bill

House Bill 430 adds New Mexico mounted patrol members to the group of officers included in the Peace Officers' Survivors Supplemental Benefits Act. The act pays \$250 thousand to family members of peace officers killed in the line of duty.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The Department of Public Safety has no record of mounted patrol members killed in the line of duty over the last ten years. Typically DPS pays the benefit to one or two officers from this fund annually.
