SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The governor and the New Mexico Legislature approved the creation of a two-year school of medicine at UNM to provide medical education and clinical care in 1961. The first class of 24 students began the fall semester in 1964, and the school of medicine was expanded to a four-year program in 1966.

In 1983 the UNM School of Medicine established New Mexico's only level-one trauma center formed the nation's first domestic disaster medical assistance team was created. Additionally, the UNM School of Medicine received a national cancer institute designation in 2005.
