Synopsis of Bill

Senate Memorial 33 directs the State Personnel Office (SPO) to provide a long-term analysis of the issues that affect job retention and recruitment in New Mexico. SM 33 also directs SPO to work with state universities and colleges to determine what skills and qualifications are needed for state employment and to help craft curricula to address those job needs.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no fiscal impact associated with this legislation. SPO currently produces an annual report which addresses many of the enumerated concerns, and which may be slightly expanded to fulfill the requirements of SM 33.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

‘Long-term’ is not defined and so it will be difficult for SPO to produce a long-term prognosis of the state’s ability to retain, attract and compensate quality employees.
