SUMMARY

SM 103 asks the governor to form a task force to collect data detailing the met and unmet needs of Native Americans residing in Santa Fe County.

The IAD would be responsible for overseeing the collection of data, identifying services provided by the state to Native Americans residing in or commuting into Santa Fe county using the tribal liaison created pursuant to the State-Tribal Collaboration Act as the task force and formulating recommendations for how the state can more efficiently meet the unmet needs of Native Americans residing in and commuting into Santa Fe county.

SM 103 would require IAD to report its findings to the appropriate interim legislative committees by September 30, 2015.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None noted; however, the tasks assigned to the IAD in this memorial are well within the purview and mission of the department and should be readily absorbed with IAD's existing operating

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budget.
