A MEMORIAL

DECLARING FEBRUARY 16, 2015 "AUTISM DAY" IN THE SENATE.

WHEREAS, one in every sixty-eight children born in 2015 will be later diagnosed as having an autism spectrum disorder; and

WHEREAS, autism affects people of all races and religions and all educational and economic levels; and

WHEREAS, autism is a lifelong condition that presents challenges to education, employment, housing and community development; and

WHEREAS, parents, professionals, self-advocates and volunteers devote countless hours to improve the quality of

2 WHEREAS, early intervention, evidence-based practices and
3 proven support systems greatly improve the outcomes and reduce
4 the lifelong costs of care of individuals with autism and their

6 WHEREAS, New Mexico celebrates and recognizes the valuable
7 contributions to its communities, businesses, technologies and
8 cultures made by people with autism; and

9 WHEREAS, the many professionals, families, advocates and
10 volunteers working to promote a greater understanding of autism
11 to improve the quality of life of those affected by autism are
12 to be commended;

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE
14 OF NEW MEXICO that February 16, 2015 be declared "Autism Day"
15 in the senate; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be
17 transmitted to the New Mexico affiliate of the autism society
18 of America.
