AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION; INCREASING THE MINIMUM PERCENTAGE
OF ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS GRANTED BY PUBLIC POST-SECONDARY
EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS TO NEW MEXICO RESIDENTS FROM TWENTYFIVE PERCENT TO FIFTY PERCENT; PROVIDING FOR A REDUCTION IN
ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUT-OF-STATE RESIDENTS AND
REALLOCATION TO NEW MEXICO RESIDENTS OR REDUCTION IN ATHLETICS
FUNDING FOR NONCOMPLIANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 21-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1970, Chapter 9, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-1-2. MATRICULATION AND TUITION FEES.--

A. Except as otherwise provided in this section and in Section [ $\frac{21-1-4.3}{21-21N-3}$ ] MMSA 1978, the boards of regents of the university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university,

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New Mexico highlands university, western New Mexico university, eastern New Mexico university, New Mexico military institute and New Mexico institute of mining and technology shall establish and charge matriculation fees and tuition fees as follows:

- each student shall be charged a matriculation fee of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) upon enrolling in each institution;
- each student who is a resident of New (2) Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than twenty dollars (\$20.00) a year;
- (3) each student who is not a resident of New Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) a year;
- each student shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each summer session; and
- (5) each student may be charged a tuition fee for extension courses.
- Except as otherwise provided in this section and in Section [21-1-4.3] 21-21N-3 NMSA 1978, the board of regents of northern New Mexico college shall establish and charge each student a matriculation fee and a tuition fee.
- The board of regents of each institution may establish and grant gratis scholarships to students who are .202173.5

residents of New Mexico in an amount not to exceed the
matriculation fee or tuition and fees, or both. These
scholarships are in addition to the lottery tuition
scholarships authorized in Section [ $\frac{21-1-4.3}{21-21N-3}$ ] MMSA
1978 and shall be granted to the full extent of available funds
before lottery tuition scholarships are granted. The number of
scholarships established and granted pursuant to this
subsection shall not exceed three percent of the preceding fall
semester enrollment in each institution and shall not be
established and granted for summer sessions. The president of
each institution shall select and recommend to the board of
regents of the institution, as recipients of scholarships,
students who possess good moral character and satisfactory
initiative, scholastic standing and personality. Beginning
with the fall semester of 2010, a minimum of one-half of the
gratis scholarships established and granted by each board of
regents each year shall be granted on the basis of financial
need, and beginning with the fall semester of 2011, a minimum
of two-thirds of the gratis scholarships established and
granted by each board of regents each year shall be granted on
the basis of financial need.

D. The board of regents or governing board of each institution set out in this subsection may establish and grant, in addition to those scholarships provided for in Subsection C of this section, athletic scholarships for tuition and fees.

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[In no event shall the board of regents of any institution be allowed to award scholarships for tuition and fees for more than the number of athletic scholarships set out in this subsection, and in no event shall more than seventy-five percent of the scholarships granted be for out-of-state residents] When athletic scholarships are granted, the board of regents or governing board shall certify to the secretary of higher education by June 1 of each year that fifty percent or more of the athletic scholarships available have been offered to students attending a public high school in the state, an accredited private high school in the state or a home school in the state registered with the public education department. At most:

- the board of regents of the university of New Mexico may grant up to two hundred ninety-three athletic scholarships;
- the board of regents of New Mexico state university may grant up to two hundred seventy athletic scholarships;
- the boards of regents of New Mexico highlands university, eastern New Mexico university and western New Mexico university may each grant up to one hundred forty athletic scholarships; and
- the governing board of New Mexico junior (4) college may grant up to fifty-two athletic scholarships.

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E. If the provisions of Subsection D of this section are not followed by an institution, the secretary of higher education shall require the institution to withdraw a sufficient number of athletic scholarships offered to out-of-state residents in order to reallocate offers so that fifty percent or more of the athletic scholarships available from the institution are offered pursuant to Subsection D of this section. If the institution does not comply with the provisions of this subsection by August 1 of each year, the secretary of higher education shall recommend a twenty-five percent reduction in the next annual appropriation for athletics for the institution.

[E.] F. In the event that the number of athletic scholarships exceeds the number of athletic scholarships permitted that institution by regulations and bylaws of the national collegiate athletic association or the national association of intercollegiate athletics of which that institution is a member, the appropriate board of regents shall reduce the number of authorized tuition scholarships to comply with association rules and regulations.

 $[F_{\bullet}]$  G. Matriculation fees and tuition fees shall be fixed and made payable as directed by the board of regents of each institution, collected by the officers of each institution and accounted for as are other funds of the institutions. Matriculation fees shall be charged only once

for each institution in which a student enrolls."

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
