15	SECTION 1. Section 66-3-1011 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1975,

19	A. A person shall not operate an off-highway motor
20	vehicle on any:
21	(1) limited access highway or freeway at any

23	(2) [any] paved street or highway except as
24	provided in Subsection B, <u>C or D</u> of this section.

1 highways, except limited access highways or freeways, if the 2 crossings are made after coming to a complete stop prior to entering the roadway. Off-highway motor vehicles shall yield 3 the right of way to oncoming traffic and shall begin a crossing 4 only when it can be executed safely and then cross in the most 5 direct manner as close to a perpendicular angle as possible. 6 7 C. Unless prohibited by ordinance or resolution of a local authority, a recreational off-highway vehicle or an 8 9 all-terrain vehicle may be operated on a paved street or highway with a speed limit not exceeding fifty-five miles per 10 hour if: 11 12 (1) the vehicle has one or more headlights and one or more taillights that comply with the Off-Highway Motor 13 14 Vehicle Act; (2) the vehicle has brakes, mirrors and 15 mufflers; 16 (3) the operator has a valid driver's license, 17 instruction permit or provisional license and an off-highway 18 motor vehicle safety permit; 19 20 (4) the operator is insured in compliance with the provisions of the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act; 21 and 22 (5) the operator of the vehicle is wearing eye 23 protection and a safety helmet that comply with the Off-Highway 24 Motor Vehicle Act. 25 .203358.3 - 2 -

By ordinance or resolution, a local authority 2 may establish separate speed limits and operating restrictions for off-highway vehicles where they are authorized to operate 3 on paved streets or highways pursuant to Subsection C of this 4 5 section. [G.] E. A person shall not operate an off-highway 6 7 motor vehicle on state game commission-owned, -controlled or -administered land except as specifically allowed pursuant to 8 9 Chapter 17, Article 6 NMSA 1978. [D.] F. A person shall not operate an off-highway 10 motor vehicle on land owned, controlled or administered by the 11 12 state parks division of the energy, minerals and natural resources department, pursuant to Chapter 16, Article 2 NMSA 13 1978, except in areas designated by and permitted by rules 14 adopted by the secretary of energy, minerals and natural 15 resources. 16 [E.] G.
