AN ACT

RELATING TO FISCAL SOLVENCY; REVERTING BALANCES OF THE
INSURANCE OPERATIONS FUND, FIRE PROTECTION FUND, FIRE
PROTECTION GRANT FUND AND LAW ENFORCEMENT PROTECTION FUND AT
THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR; REQUIRING PERIODIC ALLOTMENTS
DURING A FISCAL YEAR FROM THOSE FUNDS; MAKING NO TRANSFERS FROM
THE FIRE PROTECTION FUND TO THE FIRE PROTECTION GRANT FUND FOR
FISCAL YEAR 2017 OR 2018.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 29-13-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983,
Chapter 289, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"29-13-3. DISTRIBUTION OF CERTAIN INSURANCE [~~DIVISION~~]
COLLECTIONS--LAW ENFORCEMENT PROTECTION FUND CREATED.--There is
created in the state treasury the "law enforcement protection
fund". Ten percent of all money received for fees, licenses,

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1 penalties and taxes from life, general casualty and title
2 insurance business pursuant to the New Mexico Insurance Code,
3 except for money received from the health insurance premium
4 surtax imposed by Subsection C of Section 59A-6-2 NMSA 1978,
5 shall be paid monthly to the state treasurer and credited to
6 the fund. On or before June 30 of each year, the state
7 treasurer shall transfer to the general fund any balance in the
8 law enforcement protection fund in excess of one hundred
9 thousand dollars (\$100,000) that is not obligated [~~and that is~~
10 ~~in excess of the amount certified by the division to be~~
11 ~~distributed from that fund]~~ for expenses in that current fiscal
12 year."

13 SECTION 2. Section 29-13-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
14 Chapter 179, Section 6, as amended by Laws 2002, Chapter 78,
15 Section 5 and by Laws 2002, Chapter 92, Section 3) is amended
16 to read:

17 "29-13-4. DETERMINATION OF NEEDS AND RATE OF
18 DISTRIBUTION.--

19 A. Annually on or before April 15, the division
20 shall consider and determine the relative needs as requested by
21 tribal, municipal and university police and county sheriff's
22 departments for money in the fund in the succeeding fiscal year
23 pursuant to the provisions of Subsection C of this section.

24 B. As necessary during the year, the division shall
25 transfer an amount from the law enforcement protection fund to

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1 the peace officers', New Mexico mounted patrol members' and
2 reserve police officers' survivors fund that enables the
3 balance of the [~~peace officers' survivors~~] latter fund to be
4 maintained at a minimum balance of three hundred fifty thousand
5 dollars (\$350,000).

6 C. The division shall determine the rate of
7 distribution of money [~~remaining~~] in the fund to each tribal,
8 municipal and university police and county sheriff's department
9 as follows:

10 (1) all municipal police and county sheriff's
11 departments shall be rated by class pursuant to this paragraph
12 in accordance with populations established by the most recently
13 completed decennial census; provided that the population of any
14 county shall not include the population of any municipality
15 within that county that has a municipal police department. The
16 rate of distribution to which a municipal police or county
17 sheriff's department is entitled is the following:

18 CLASS	POPULATION	AMOUNT
19 1	0 to 20,000	\$20,000
20 2	20,001 to 160,000	30,000
21 3	160,001 to 1,280,000	40,000;

22 (2) university police departments shall be
23 entitled to a rate of distribution of seventeen thousand
24 dollars (\$17,000);

25 (3) tribal police departments shall be

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1 entitled, unless allocations are adjusted pursuant to the
2 provisions of Subsection [E] D of this section, to six hundred
3 dollars (\$600) for each commissioned peace officer in the
4 tribe. To be counted as a commissioned peace officer for the
5 purposes of this paragraph, a commissioned peace officer shall
6 have been assigned to duty and have worked in New Mexico for no
7 fewer than two hundred days in the calendar year immediately
8 prior to the date of payment. Payments shall be made for only
9 those divisions of the tribal police departments that perform
10 services in New Mexico. [~~No~~] A tribal police department shall
11 not be eligible for any disbursement under the fund if
12 commissioned peace officers cite non-Indians into the tribal
13 court for civil or criminal citations; and

14 (4) municipal and university police and county
15 sheriff's departments shall be entitled, unless allocations are
16 adjusted pursuant to the provisions of Subsection D of this
17 section, to six hundred dollars (\$600) for each police officer
18 or sheriff's deputy employed full time [~~by his department~~] who
19 has been certified by the New Mexico law enforcement academy as
20 a police officer or has been authorized to act as a New Mexico
21 peace officer pursuant to the provisions of Section 29-1-11
22 NMSA 1978.

23 D. After distributions are determined in accordance
24 with Subsection A, Subsection B and Paragraphs (1) and (2) of
25 Subsection C of this section, if the balance in the fund is

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1 insufficient to permit the total allocations provided by
2 Paragraphs (3) and (4) of Subsection C of this section, the
3 division shall reduce that allocation to the maximum amount
4 permitted by available money."

5 SECTION 3. Section 29-13-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983,
6 Chapter 289, Section 6, as amended by Laws 2002, Chapter 78,
7 Section 6 and by Laws 2002, Chapter 92, Section 4) is amended
8 to read:

9 "29-13-6. DISTRIBUTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT PROTECTION
10 FUND.--

11 A. [~~Annually on or before July 31~~] Based on a
12 periodic allotment approved by the division for the current
13 fiscal year, the state treasurer shall distribute from the fund
14 the amounts certified by the division to be distributed to
15 governmental entities and [~~the transfer shall distribute money~~
16 ~~from the law enforcement protection fund to~~] the peace
17 officers', New Mexico mounted patrol members' and reserve
18 police officers' survivors fund as required in Section 29-13-4
19 NMSA 1978. Payments shall be made [~~to~~] by the treasurer [~~of~~]
20 to the appropriate governmental entity or fund unless otherwise
21 specified in Subsection C of this section.

22 B. The state treasurer is authorized to redirect a
23 distribution to the New Mexico finance authority in an amount
24 certified by the division, pursuant to an ordinance or a
25 resolution passed by the municipality or county and a written

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1 agreement of the municipality or county and the New Mexico
2 finance authority.

3 C. ~~[Annually on or before July 31]~~ Based on a
4 periodic allotment approved by the division for the current
5 fiscal year, the state treasurer shall distribute from the
6 money in the fund money certified by the division to be
7 distributed to tribes. Payment shall be made to the chief
8 financial officer of the tribe. If necessary, the fund may be
9 decreased below the level of one hundred thousand dollars
10 (\$100,000) to enable payment to the tribes. If insufficient
11 money remains in the fund to fully compensate the tribes, a
12 report shall be made to the ~~[New Mexico office of]~~ Indian
13 affairs department and to an appropriate interim committee of
14 the legislature that reviews issues having impact on tribes by
15 September 1 of the year of the shortfall."

16 SECTION 4. Section 59A-6-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984,
17 Chapter 127, Section 105, as amended) is amended to read:

18 "59A-6-5. DISTRIBUTION OF ~~[DIVISION]~~ OFFICE
19 COLLECTIONS.--

20 A. All money received by the ~~[division]~~ office of
21 superintendent of insurance for fees, licenses, penalties and
22 taxes shall be paid daily by the superintendent to the state
23 treasurer and credited to the "insurance department suspense
24 fund" except as provided by ~~[(1)]~~ the Law Enforcement
25 Protection Fund Act ~~[and~~

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1 refunds are made pursuant to Subsection B of this section and
2 after any allocations have been made pursuant to Subsection C
3 of this section, the treasurer shall make the following
4 transfers from the balance remaining in the insurance
5 department suspense fund:

6 (1) to the "fire protection fund", that part
7 of the balance derived from property and vehicle insurance
8 business;

9 (2) to the insurance operations fund, that
10 part of the balance derived from the fees imposed pursuant to
11 Subsections A and E of Section 59A-6-1 NMSA 1978 other than
12 fees derived from property and vehicle insurance business; and

13 (3) to the general fund, the balance remaining
14 in the insurance department suspense fund derived from all
15 other kinds of insurance business."

16 SECTION 5. Section 59A-53-5.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2007,
17 Chapter 152, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

18 "59A-53-5.2. APPROPRIATIONS AND TRANSFERS FROM THE FIRE
19 PROTECTION FUND.--

20 A. For each fiscal year, the amount to be
21 distributed by the marshal pursuant to Sections 59A-53-4,
22 59A-53-5 and 59A-53-5.1 NMSA 1978 is appropriated from the fire
23 protection fund to the superintendent for the purpose of making
24 the following distributions:

25 ~~[B. For the purposes of Subsections C and D of this~~

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1 ~~section, the "remaining balance in the fire protection fund"~~
2 ~~shall be calculated on June 30 of each year and shall equal the~~
3 ~~balance of the fund on that date less the sum of]~~

4 (1) the total amount to be distributed during
5 the ~~[succeeding]~~ fiscal year pursuant to Sections 59A-53-4,
6 59A-53-5 and 59A-53-5.1 NMSA 1978; ~~[and]~~

7 (2) the total amount of other appropriations
8 from the fire protection fund for the ~~[succeeding]~~ fiscal year;

9 (3) on June 30, 2017, no distribution shall be
10 made to the fire protection grant fund; and

11 (4) beginning in fiscal year 2019, periodic
12 allotments not to exceed forty and two-tenths percent of the
13 projected remaining balance in the fire protection fund shall
14 be distributed to the fire protection grant fund.

14 ~~D.]~~ B. On June 30 of each year, the remaining
15 balance in the fire protection fund [~~less the amount to be~~
16 ~~transferred on that date pursuant to Subsection C of this~~
17 ~~section]~~ shall be transferred to the general fund."

18 SECTION 6. Section 59A-53-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984,
19 Chapter 127, Section 978, as amended) is amended to read:

20 "59A-53-7. DISTRIBUTION OF FIRE PROTECTION FUND.--

21 A. [~~Annually on or before the last day of July]~~
22 Based on periodic allotments approved by the marshal, the
23 state treasurer shall distribute from the money in the fire
24 protection fund, to each municipality and county fire
25 district, the amount that the marshal or the public

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1 regulation commission, as the case may be, has certified to
2 the state treasurer. Payment shall be made to the treasurer
3 of any municipality and to the county treasurer of the county
4 in which any county fire district is located for credit to
5 the county fire district.

6 B. The state treasurer is authorized to redirect
7 a distribution to the New Mexico finance authority in the
8 amount that the marshal or the public regulation commission,
9 as the case may be, has certified to the state treasurer
10 pursuant to an ordinance or a resolution passed by the
11 municipality or county and a written agreement of the
12 municipality or county in which any county fire district is
13 located and the New Mexico finance authority.

14 C. In addition to the distributions made pursuant
15 to Subsections A and B of this section, upon certification by
16 the marshal that the balance of the firefighters' survivors
17 fund is less than two hundred fifty thousand dollars
18 (\$250,000), the state treasurer shall distribute an amount
19 from the fire protection fund to the firefighters' survivors
20 fund so that the balance of the firefighters' survivors fund
21 equals two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)."

22 SECTION 7. Section 59A-53-18 NMSA 1978 (being Laws
23 2006, Chapter 103, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read:

24 "59A-53-18. FIRE PROTECTION GRANT FUND--CREATED--
25 USES.--The "fire protection grant fund" is created in the

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1 state treasury. The fund shall consist of transfers,
2 distributions, appropriations, gifts, grants, donations and
3 bequests made to the fund. [~~Income from the fund shall be~~
4 ~~credited to the fund, and~~] Money in the fund shall [~~not~~]
5 revert [~~or be transferred to any other~~] to the general fund
6 at the end of a fiscal year. Money in the fund is
7 appropriated to the fire protection grant council for the
8 purposes of making distributions approved by the council for
9 the critical needs of municipal fire departments and county
10 fire districts. Expenditures from the fund shall be made on
11 warrant of the secretary of finance and administration
12 pursuant to vouchers signed by the marshal."

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
