11	RELATING TO THE STATE GAME COMMISSION; PROVIDING FOR THE NEW
12	MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO APPOINT FOUR COMMISSIONERS;
13	SETTING TERM LIMITS FOR COMMISSIONERS; ADDING REQUIREMENTS FOR
14	APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL OF COMMISSIONERS.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 17-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1921,
18	Chapter 35, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"17-1-2. STATE GAME COMMISSIONAPPOINTMENTTERM
20	<u>A.</u> To carry out the purpose of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978
21	and all other acts for like purpose, there is created a "state
22	game commission" of seven members. [ <del>not more than four of whom</del>
23	shall be of the same political party at the time of their
24	appointment. The]
25	<u>B. Three</u> members of the commission shall be
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1	appointed by the governor, <u>no two residing in the same</u>
2	congressional district, and no more than two affiliated with
3	the same political party.
4	C. Four members of the commission shall be
5	appointed by the New Mexico legislative council, no more than
6	two affiliated with the same political party. Those four
7	appointees shall consist of:
8	(1) one representative from the non-
9	consumptive outdoor recreation conservation community;
10	(2) one representative from the sportsmen
11	community, as evidenced by holding a current valid fishing or
12	hunting license and having held a valid fishing or hunting
13	license each of the previous four years;
14	(3) one representative from the agricultural
15	community, as evidenced by owning or managing a farm or ranch;
16	and
17	(4) one scientist specializing in biology,
18	<u>ecology or wildlife management from a state educational</u>
19	institution.
20	D. A person shall not be eligible to be appointed
21	as a commissioner if the person changed party affiliation, was
22	affiliated with a new party or became unaffiliated during the
23	previous four years.
24	E. All commissioners shall be appointed with the
25	advice and consent of the senate. The term of office for each
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1	member of the commission shall be [ <del>four</del> ] <u>six</u> years, <u>except as</u>
2	provided in this subsection. At the time of making the
3	governor's first three appointments, the governor shall
4	designate [ <del>the commissioners' terms as being one, two, three or</del>
5	four years so that the term of no more than two commissioners
6	shall expire each year.
7	In making appointments to the state game commission, one
8	member shall be appointed from each of the following districts:
9	A. district one: Curry, De Baca, Roosevelt,
10	Chaves, Lincoln, Otero, Eddy and Lea counties;
11	B. district two: Catron, Socorro, Grant, Hidalgo,
12	Luna, Sierra and Dona Ana counties;
13	C. district three: San Juan, McKinley, Cibola,
14	Valencia, Sandoval, Los Alamos and Rio Arriba counties;
15	D. district four: Santa Fe, Taos, Colfax, Union,
16	Mora, Harding, Quay, San Miguel, Guadalupe and Torrance
17	<del>counties; and</del>
18	E. district five: Bernalillo county. The
19	remaining two members shall be appointed at-large. At least
20	one member of the commission shall manage and operate a farm or
21	ranch that contains at least two species of wildlife on that
22	part which is deeded land requiring licensing prior to legal
23	pursuit under the provisions of Section 17-3-2 NMSA 1978. At
24	least one member shall have a demonstrated history of
25	involvement in wildlife and habitat protection issues and whose
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1	activities or occupation are not in conflict with wildlife and
2	habitat advocacy.] one commissioner to serve a two-year term,
3	one commissioner to serve a four-year term and one commissioner
4	to serve a six-year term. At the time of making the New Mexico
5	legislative council's first four appointments, the council
6	<u>shall designate:</u>
7	(1) the representative of the conservation
8	<u>community to serve a six-year term;</u>
9	(2) the representative of the sportsmen
10	<u>community to serve a four-year term;</u>
11	(3) the representative of the agricultural
12	community to serve a six-year term; and
13	(4) the scientist to serve a six-year term.
14	F. Commissioners shall serve for no more than two
15	terms. If a commissioner is appointed to fill a vacancy, that
16	commissioner shall serve the balance of the term for the
17	commissioner being replaced. A partial term shall be
18	counted as one full term.
19	<u>G. When a commissioner dies, resigns or no longer</u>
20	meets the qualifications required for the commissioner's
21	original selection, that position on the commission
22	becomes vacant. The original appointing authority for the
23	vacant position shall appoint a successor in the same manner as
24	the original selection for that position was made.
25	H. A commissioner may be removed from the
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1	commission by the appointing person or entity for failure to
2	attend three consecutive meetings or other cause, in the manner
3	provided for removal of members of boards of regents under
4	Article 12, Section 13 of the constitution of New Mexico. A
5	vacancy in the commission occurring other than by expiration of
6	term shall be filled in the same manner as the original
7	appointment but for the unexpired term only.
8	I. A commissioner shall not have a financial
9	conflict of interest or have a contract with the department of
10	game and fish.
11	<u>J.</u> The state game commission as provided in Chapter
12	17 NMSA 1978 shall have the same authority, powers and duties
13	as now vested in the state game commission by law [ <del>and each</del>
14	member of the state game commission shall serve until his
15	successor has been appointed and qualified]."
16	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
17	provisions of this act is January 1, 2019.
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
