# AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EDUCATION; AMENDING THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE
TO SPECIFY AND CLARIFY THE DUTIES OF THE PUBLIC EDUCATION
COMMISSION IN TERMS OF THE REQUIREMENT TO DEVELOP AN EDUCATION
STRATEGIC PLAN; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 22-2-2.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2004, Chapter 27, Section 17) is amended to read:

### "22-2-2.2. COMMISSION--DUTIES.--

A. The commission shall work with the department to develop the five-year strategic plan for public elementary and secondary education in the state. [The strategic plan shall be updated at least biennially. The commission shall solicit the input of persons who have an interest in public school policy, including local school boards, school districts and school

1	employees; home schooling associations; parent-teacher		
2	associations; educational organizations; the commission on

6	providers; and business organizations. In carrying out its		
7	duties, the commission shall:		
8	(1) convene advisory panels and engage key		
9	stakeholders with interest and experience in early childhood,

13	(b) home schooling associations and		
14	<pre>interest groups;</pre>		
15	(c) parent-teacher organizations;		
16	(d) educational organizations;		
17	(e) the higher education department and		
18	universities, community colleges and vocational schools;		
19	(f) state agencies responsible for		
20	educating resident students;		
21	(g) juvenile justice agencies;		
22	(h) various local, state and national		
23	subject matter experts and advocates;		
24	(i) workforce development providers; and		
25	(j) business and civic leaders;		

1	(2) evaluate the current and potential			
2	education system funding mechanisms;			
3	(3) evaluate the effect of the federal Every			
4	Student Succeeds Act on public education in New Mexico;			
5	(4) evaluate the needs of English language			
6	learners and special education and at-risk students;			
7	(5) evaluate the implementation of innovations			
8	and incentives to improve academic outcomes for Hispanic,			
9	Native American and African-American students;			
10	(6) evaluate the effectiveness of the current			
11	level of investment in education in the state and the process			
12	for its financing; and			
13	(7) propose a long-range financing plan that			
14	is both sufficient to support the recommendations of the			
15	commission and ensures sustained funding into the future.			
16	B. The commission shall update the strategic plan			
17	biennially and present to the governor and the legislature its			
18	recommendations prior to each legislative session in odd-			
19	numbered years.			
20	[B.] C. In addition to the $[duty]$ duties provided			
21	in [Subsection] Subsections A and B of this section, the			
22	commission shall:
