21	disposition of a dead human body as quickly as possible,
22	without a direct disposer performing or arranging a funeral,
23	graveside service, committal service or memorial service,
24	whether public or private, and without embalming of the body
25	unless embalming is required by the place of disposition;
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 $[J_{\cdot}]$ <u>K.</u> "direct supervision" means that the supervising funeral service practitioner is physically present with and in direct control of the person being trained;

[K.] L. "disposition" means the final disposal of a dead human body, whether it be by earth interment, above-ground interment or entombment, cremation, burial at sea or delivery to a medical school, when the medical school assumes complete responsibility for the disposal of the body following medical study;

[L.] M. "embalming" means the disinfection, preservation and restoration, when possible, of a dead human body by a licensed funeral service practitioner or a licensed funeral service intern under the supervision of a licensed funeral service practitioner;

[M.] <u>N.</u> "ennichement" means interment of cremains in a niche in a columbarium, whether in an urn or not;

 $[N_{\cdot}]$ O. "entombment" means interment of a casketed body or cremains in a crypt in a mausoleum;

 $[\Theta_{\tau}]$ <u>P</u>. "establishment" means every office, premises or place of business where the practice of funeral service or direct disposition is conducted or advertised as being conducted and includes commercial establishments that provide for the practice of funeral service or direct disposition services exclusively to licensed funeral or direct disposition establishments or a school of medicine; .205541.1

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 $[P_{\cdot}]$ Q. "funeral" means a period following death in which there is an organized, purposeful, time-limited, group-centered ceremony or rite, whether religious or not, with the body of the deceased present;

[Q.] <u>R.</u> "funeral merchandise" means that personal property offered for sale in connection with the transportation, funeralization or disposition of a dead human body, including the enclosure into which a dead human body is or cremains are directly placed, and excluding mausoleum crypts, interment enclosures preset in a cemetery and columbarium niches;

S. "funeral service director" means a person licensed to make arrangements for or direct funerals at a funeral establishment or commercial establishment that is licensed pursuant to the Funeral Services Act;

[R.] <u>T.</u> "funeral service intern" means a person licensed to be in training for the practice of funeral service under the supervision and instruction of a funeral service practitioner at a funeral establishment or commercial establishment, licensed pursuant to the Funeral Services Act;

[S.] U. "funeral service practitioner" means a person licensed to engage in the practice of funeral service at a funeral establishment or commercial establishment that is licensed pursuant to the Funeral Services Act;

[T.] <u>V.</u> "funeral services" means those immediate .205541.1

"licensee in charge" means a funeral service practitioner who is ultimately responsible for the conduct of a funeral or commercial establishment and its employees; or a direct disposer who is ultimately responsible for the conduct of a direct disposition establishment and its employees;

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not to count as time served toward completion of the 2 apprenticeship. It is the responsibility of the funeral 3 service director and the licensee in charge to report changes of employment.

A funeral service director may be under the 5 F. supervision of more than one funeral service practitioner at 6 7 the establishment at which the funeral service director is employed; provided that the board has received notice in 8 9 writing prior to any changes in supervision. The board may adopt rules specifying the maximum number of persons that may 10 be supervised by a funeral service practitioner. 11

G. An apprentice funeral service director shall report to the board quarterly, upon forms provided by the board, and shall:

(1) show the work that has been completed 15 during the preceding three months; and 16

submit proof of employment and supervision (2) as required by board rules."

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
