Synopsis of House Joint Memorial

House Joint Memorial requests the Legislative Council Service to study the use of a revisor of statutes including the cost and process of employment.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be a minimal fiscal impact if any with HJM 20. The proposed study can be conducted by an existing staff member or be done through a small contract.

It should be noted though, a fiscal impact could materialize in future fiscal years if a revisor of statutes position is created and could cost up to \$90.0 thousand.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to House Joint Memorial 20:

- NM legislature has crafted and passed many laws since 1912 and are still in statutes;
- NM laws contain antiquated, confusing or invalid language or provisions;
- Many states have created a revisor of statutes within their bill drafting services;
 and
- The job of a revisor of statutes is to report to the drafting service any defects

found in/state statute or the state constitution and to draft proposed legislation for recommendation to the legislature.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

Assistance of the study can be provided by the National Council of State Legislatures. According to NCSL website publication of 2012, a number of state legislators have a revisor of statues as part of their drafting/legal services offices. These states include: Alaska, Colorado, Florida, Hawaii, Kansas, Maine, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and Washington.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The New Mexico Compilation Commission is authorized to prepare and keep current parallel tables of the New Mexico statutes.
