### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Memorial

Senate Memorial 96 requests the Taxation and Revenue Department (TRD) to convene a two-tiered driver’s license advisory task force. The task force is to include people representing New Mexico’s senior citizens, residents of rural areas, those with mobility limitations, homeless people and immigrants, as well as TRD, New Mexico’s congressional delegation, and anyone else deemed beneficial to the group. The task force will study challenges and propose solutions related to the implementation of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005 and New Mexico’s two-tiered driver’s license structure. A report would be compiled and presented to the appropriate interim committee.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal impact.

**SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

In response from customer and advocacy group inquiries and feedback received during legislative hearings, the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) has begun to meet with advocacy groups representing immigrant groups, homeless advocates, senior citizens and community outreach organizations. The intent of these meetings is to seek solutions that meet their constituents' needs while maintaining Real ID compliance and current security requirements required by the legacy credential and the Driving Authorization Card at MVD. Ultimately, the outcome of such efforts may result in regulatory changes.

**TECHNICAL ISSUES**

The memorial does not specify a timeline for when the report should be finished and reported to the appropriate interim legislative committee.
