SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Memorial 115 requests the New Mexico councils of governments allow New Mexico land grant communities to be members of these regional councils so that all local communities would be included in governing decisions and community development.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal impact to the state is anticipated.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SM 115 recognizes the historical importance of New Mexico's land grant communities to the state's culture and their embodiment of positive community growth and economic development. It notes that the state's six regional councils of governments are multiservice entities that deliver numerous federal, state and local programs, and also function as planning organizations, technical assistance providers and visionaries to their member local governments.
