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10 A MEMORIAL

11 ASKING THE VETERANS' SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO CONVENE A TASK  
12 FORCE TO CONDUCT LISTENING SESSIONS IN VARIOUS GEOGRAPHIC  
13 REGIONS OF THE STATE WITH VETERANS ORGANIZATIONS,  
14 REPRESENTATIVES OF CITIES, COUNTIES, NATIVE AMERICAN NATIONS,  
15 TRIBES AND PUEBLOS, AND THE WORKFORCE SOLUTIONS DEPARTMENT TO  
16 ASSESS WHAT ADDITIONAL SUPPORT OR POLICIES ARE NEEDED AND TO  
17 IMPLEMENT THEM TO HELP PREVENT VETERAN SUICIDE IN NEW MEXICO.

19 WHEREAS, according to the United States department of  
20 veterans affairs, in 2014, an average of twenty veterans died  
21 from suicide each day; and

22 WHEREAS, in 2014, veterans constituted eight and one-half  
23 percent of the United States population and, in that year,  
24 veterans accounted for eighteen percent of all deaths from  
25 suicide among adults in the United States; and

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1           WHEREAS, there is a high incidence of suicide among  
2 middle-aged and older veterans; and

3           WHEREAS, in 2014, sixty-five percent of all veteran  
4 suicide victims were age fifty years or older; and

5           WHEREAS, screening and assessment processes have been set  
6 up throughout the department of veterans affairs system to  
7 assist in the identification of patients at risk for suicide;  
8 and

9           WHEREAS, predictive modeling is used to determine which  
10 veterans may be at highest risk of suicide, so providers can  
11 intervene early; and

12           WHEREAS, veterans at the highest risk are identified  
13 before clinical signs of suicide are evident to save lives  
14 before crises occur; and

15           WHEREAS, the United States department of veterans affairs  
16 is implementing a multifaceted system to take a proactive  
17 approach to combat veteran suicide, including tele-mental  
18 health services, software applications, telephone coaching and  
19 leveraging veteran centers and universities; and

20           WHEREAS, it is of critical importance to consider which  
21 tools would be most effective to prevent veteran suicide in New  
22 Mexico, and to implement them;

23           NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE  
24 OF NEW MEXICO that the veterans' services department be asked  
25 to convene a task force to conduct listening sessions in

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1 various geographic regions of the state with veterans  
2 organizations, representatives of cities, counties, Native  
3 American nations, tribes and pueblos, and the workforce  
4 solutions department to assess what additional support or  
5 policies are needed to help prevent veteran suicide in New  
6 Mexico and to implement them; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be requested to  
8 report its findings to the interim legislative military and  
9 veterans' affairs committee; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be  
11 transmitted to the secretary of veterans' services, the  
12 secretary of workforce solutions, the secretary of Indian  
13 affairs and members of the interim legislative military and  
14 veterans' affairs committee.

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
