

1 A JOINT MEMORIAL

2 REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CREATE A
3 COMMITTEE THAT INCLUDES RELEVANT STATE AGENCIES AND PRIVATE
4 ENTITIES TO REVIEW THE CURRENT AND DEVELOPING STATE OF
5 AUTONOMOUS VEHICLE TECHNOLOGY AND DEVELOP A PROPOSAL TO ALLOW
6 AUTONOMOUS VEHICLE USE IN NEW MEXICO WHILE ENSURING PUBLIC
7 SAFETY.

9 WHEREAS, in October 2017, the national highway traffic
10 safety administration reported that the yearly nationwide
11 average for police-reported vehicle accidents for the ten
12 years from 2006 through 2015 was more than five million seven
13 hundred seventy thousand; and

14 WHEREAS, the yearly nationwide average number of
15 fatalities from vehicle accidents for the ten years from 2006
16 through 2015 was more than thirty-two thousand; and

17 WHEREAS, the national highway traffic safety
18 administration estimates that ninety-four percent of all
19 vehicle accidents are caused by human error; and

20 WHEREAS, a vehicle with modern technology can monitor a
21 wealth of information regarding roadway hazards and the
22 movement of other vehicles within its vicinity; and

23 WHEREAS, current and developing autonomous vehicle
24 technology holds the promise of providing continuous
25 attention to changing traffic conditions and faster

1 reaction time than human drivers; and

2 WHEREAS, some of the new model vehicles currently being
3 sold are equipped for semiautonomous operation; and

4 WHEREAS, fully autonomous vehicles are currently in
5 limited use in pilot projects in Phoenix, Arizona, and in
6 other areas, and their presence on United States roadways is
7 expected to grow rapidly; and

8 WHEREAS, autonomous vehicles may have significant
9 effects on road use, road safety, road maintenance, vehicle
10 registration, operator licensing, vehicle repair and
11 modification, accident liability and security; and

12 WHEREAS, traditionally, individual states have been
13 responsible for setting the standards for vehicle
14 registration, operator licensing and traffic laws; and

15 WHEREAS, the state of New Mexico is dedicated to road
16 safety, and motor vehicle policies and laws should be
17 consistent throughout the state; and

18 WHEREAS, state policy and laws to accommodate the
19 growing market for autonomous vehicles should be developed
20 with the involvement of experts and stakeholders from both
21 the private sector and public agencies;

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
23 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of transportation be
24 requested to create and lead an autonomous vehicle committee
25 to review the current and developing technology for

1 autonomous vehicle operation and existing state policy and
2 statutes that may be relevant to autonomous vehicle
3 operations; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in addition to other
5 individuals or organizations the department of transportation
6 may include, the autonomous vehicle committee include at
7 least one member representing each of the department of
8 transportation, the department of public safety, the taxation
9 and revenue department, the department of information
10 technology, the economic development department and the
11 public regulation commission; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the autonomous vehicle
13 committee further solicit comments from a wide spectrum of
14 public and private stakeholders; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the autonomous vehicle
16 committee present a report to the appropriate legislative
17 interim committee prior to that committee's final meeting in
18 2018; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report include
20 recommendations for statutory changes and administrative
21 policies and programs that may be needed to allow the sale
22 and operation of autonomous vehicles in New Mexico while
23 ensuring public safety; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be
25 transmitted to the governor, the secretary of transportation,

1 the secretary of public safety, the secretary of taxation
2 and revenue, the secretary of information technology, the
3 secretary of economic development and the public regulation
4 commission.
